The former recently won the Philip Converse book prize, and the latter won the Alexander George



book prize that same year. Marc has published numerous articles in the American Political Science Review, American Journal of Political Science, Journal of Politics, Public Opinion Quarterly, and British Journal of Political Science. He's a past winner of the Emerging Scholar Award from the APSA section on Elections, Public Opinion, and Voting Behavior, and he has won several teaching awards over the years. His research focuses on the intersection of public opinion and political context. The causes and consequences of polarization and declining trust in government in the electorate have been the central focus of his research. Before beginning graduate school, he worked in politics for two years and continues to count real world politics among his passions.
